

302 - Freud in Depth

Target Audience: This course is intended for psychoanalytic candidates and other clinicians at an intermediate to advanced levels of psychoanalytic study. Academicians and others are invited with instructor approval.

Prerequisites: This class is open to matriculated students in the psychoanalytic tracks. Students will need to have completed all, or nearly all, of the classes in the core curriculum. Individuals who have graduated from the Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy track, or students in that track who have completed nearly all of the core curriculum and have at least one case in progress, may also take the course with permission of the instructors, Burton Hutto, MD and Edward Abse, PhD.

Format: This class will be limited to 12 participants and will combine lecture and seminar formats; student participation is expected. Classes may include discussion of clinical material by both the instructors and the participants. Classes meet over Zoom.

Description: This class explores the many contributions to psychoanalysis made by Freud. We will focus on his more clinically pertinent works and his development of theory. We will be reading primarily to find the enduring clinical relevance of Freud's ideas. We will not be indoctrinating (of course) nor will we want to spend too much time in criticism of Freud (which could easily take all available time we have). We are looking for the pearls scattered within the writings, observing the evolution of his thoughts, and finding the threads from Freud to more modern psychoanalytic theory.

Course Syllabus: Freud in Depth

About the Instructors:

Burton Hutto, MD is a psychiatrist and psychoanalyst who is a Professor of Psychiatry at the UNC School of Medicine. He is Director of the Psychotherapy Clinic for psychiatry residents and Medical Director of the crisis

unit of inpatient psychiatry at UNC Hospitals. He is a graduate of the UNC-Duke Psychoanalytic Education Program, now known as the Psychoanalytic Center of the Carolinas, and he is on the faculty of the Psychoanalytic Center of the Carolinas.

Edward Abse, PhD is a cultural anthropologist (MSc London School of Economics & Political Science; PhD University of Virginia) with primary interests in shamanism, the comparative study of religion, and the ethnography of indigenous peoples of the Americas. He has carried out research in Latin America as well as individual fieldwork with native Mesoamerican societies in the highlands of southern Mexico. He studied the works of Freud in courses at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, and he has since pursued this interest further to explore later and more recent developments in psychoanalytic theory and practice (e.g., Object Relations approaches). His research includes a psychoanalytically informed ethnographic perspective on the dynamics of social and religious change as well as the interpretation of dreams and the religious experiences of his research subjects (e.g., his publication "Don Patricio's Dream: Shamanism and the Torments of Secrecy in Fieldwork among the Mazatec Indians"). Dr. Abse was on the faculty of the Anthropology program at Virginia Commonwealth University for 13 years and previously taught at the University of Richmond and the University of Virginia.
