Target Audience: This course is intended for clinicians at intermediate through advanced levels.

**Format:** All PCC courses include small group discussions which require participants to read and synthesize the materials presented. Class participation may include presentations, clinical material, collaborations, and discussion.

**Description**: This 8-week course on couple psychoanalytic psychotherapy follows the model as conceptualised and used clinically in the work with couples developed over many years at Tavistock Relationships, London. The emphasis in couple psychoanalytic psychotherapy is on what is unconsciously shared between the couple, and how they externalise their inner worlds of their primary relationships in the present relationship and in the consulting room. The therapist, through their ability to maintain 'a couple state of mind' can begin to understand a couple's particular relationship through projections, anxieties, defenses and unconscious phantasies.

#### **About the Instructor:**

Tricia Coleman trained in London at what was then called the Tavistock Marital Studies Institute (now Tavistock Relationships). Following the British model of completing a training course, she qualified to practice as a Couple Psychoanalytic Psychotherapist. She was a visiting lecturer on the couple psychoanalytic training at the Tavistock, as well as a tutor and supervisor of the course. After her couple training, Tricia studied at the British Psychoanalytic Association (BPA) where she qualified to practice as a Psychoanalyst. She is a member of the IPA and the European Federation of Psychoanalysis (EPF). For three years she served on the Board of the BPA where she was also a member of the Scientific Committee and of the study group on Gender and Sexuality. She has taught on the BPA training, on the Introductory Lectures, and the Foundation Courses at the BPA.

Tricia is a new member of the PCC and of APsA. She works in private practice in Raleigh, NC, seeing both analytic patients and couples.

# **Course Learning Objectives**

Class participants will be able to:

- 1. Discuss shared psychic space in couple life and the difficulties encountered in sharing psychic space.
- 2. Describe the paranoid-schizoid and depressive positions and how this understanding is applied to couple work.
- 3. Describe the Kleinian concept of unconscious phantasy and its shared nature in couple psychoanalytic psychotherapy.
- 4. Explain the nature of projective identification and its place in couple life, both as a defence and as a communication.
- 5. Demonstrate how a couple use projective identification to transfer their unconscious phantasies to one another and to the therapist and how the therapist uses his/her countertransference to gain understanding of this phenomenon.
- 6. Explain Bion's concept of the container/contained and how it is used in couple psychoanalytic psychotherapy.
- 7. Explain how the concept of the 'third 'provides a deeper understanding of the couple's state of mind.
- 8. Describe the patriarchal structure's contribution to the psychoanalytic concept of splitting by reinforcing psychic divisions such as the idealization of masculinity and the subsequent denigration of femininity.
- 9. Demonstrate the methods of couple assessment for couple psychoanalytic psychotherapy and to ascertain the different kinds of couple psychotherapy endings.
